The yarn requirements as given apply to the pattern as written when worked by the average knitter. Any changes to sleeve lengths, body lengths etc. require the purchase of additional yarn.

# PEAKED CAPS

**MATERIALS REQUIRED:**

## BOUQUET RAGG

- 1 x 100 g ball <sup>3.75</sup>
- 1 pair needles size 4.00 mm (Canadian size 8) for ribbing
- 1 pair needles size 5.00 mm (Canadian size 6) for main body of the garment or whatever size you require to achieve the correct tension. <sup>4 1/2 mm</sup>
- 1 button about 1" in diameter.

**ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS:**

## BOUQUET NANTUK OR BOUQUET ISLANDER

**TENSION:**

10 sts to 5cm (2 inches) measured over stocking stitch using the larger size needles.

**SIZES:** *Small and Large*

Using the smaller size needles cast on 80 (90) sts.

Work 1 inch in K1, P1 rib.

Change to larger size needles.

**Row 1** \*K9, P1\* repeat from \* to \* to end of row 8 (9) patterns.

**Row 2** \*K1, P9\* repeat from \* to \* to end of row.

**Row 3** \*K9, inc 1 st (see instruction below) P1\* repeat from \* to \* to end.

**Row 4** \*K1, P10\* repeat from \* to \* to end of row.

Continue in this manner increasing each knit row until there are 13 (16) sts in each pattern.

Work even on these sts until the work measures 4 (4 1/2) inches, ending with a purl row.

**Next row** \*K11 (14) P2tog, P1\* repeat from \* to \* to end of row.

**Next row** \*K2, P11 (14)\* repeat from \* to \* to end of row.

Continue in this manner decreasing each knit row until there are 24 (27) sts.

Break the yarn leaving an 18" end. Thread this through the sts remaining on the needle and draw up firmly.

Sew the seam.

**THE PEAK:**

Using the larger size needles cast on 7 sts.

**Row 1** Knit.

**Row 2** K3, P2, K2

**Row 3** K3, inc 1 st, K1, inc 1 st, K3

**Row 4** K3, purl to last 2 sts, K2

Continue in this manner increasing 1 st either side of the centre stitch in each knit row until there are 27 sts on the needle.

Work even on these sts until 21 (27) rows have been worked taking care to maintain the knit sts at each end of every row.

Now decrease 1 st either side of the centre stitch in each knit row until 7 sts remain.

Cast off.

Fold the peak in half and sew to the cap.

**BUTTON:**

Using the larger size needles cast on 8 sts.

Work 10 rows in stocking stitch. Cast off leaving a 12 inch end. Run this thread around the outer edge of the piece and after placing the button in the centre draw up firmly. Sew to the top of the cap.

**TO INCREASE:**

Pick up the loop between the right hand and left hand needles. Twist the loop and knit it. 1 stitch made. Note that it is important to twist the loop otherwise there will be a hole in the work.

# RAGG VEST

**MATERIALS REQUIRED:**

## BOUQUET RAGG YARN

- 3 (3:4:4) x 100 g balls
- 1 pair needles size 4.00 mm (Canadian size 8) for ribbing
- 1 pair needles size 5.00 mm (Canadian size 6) for body of the garment or the size you require to achieve the correct tension.
- Stitch holders
